



WHAT IS A CROQUE-LIVRES?

Inspired by the “Take a book, leave a book” movement, the Croque-livres initiative is a network of book-sharing boxes for children aged 0 to 12 in Quebec. Launched in September 2014, the project’s goal is to bring together and mobilize communities around the joy of reading. Organizations, institutions, companies and even individuals adopt and manage Croque-livres boxes, which are drop-off points where children and their families can enjoy free access to shared books.
